And last, but certainly not least, it tells us of Jesus. This parable tells us that the crucified and risen One knows himself to be the unique Son of the Father. He also knows that through his rejection, condemnation, death, and resurrection he would become the cornerstone, fulfilling the prophecy of Psalm 118:22: "The stone rejected by the builders has become the cornerstone."

For us, we know, or should know, that "by the Lord has this been done, and it is wonderful in our eyes" (Psalm 118:23). It is indeed wonderful that the Father has sent his Son to us and for us. He is our Lord and Savior, the cornerstone of the Church and of our lives. In him, we have come to know "the peace of God that surpasses all understanding" (Philippians 4:7).

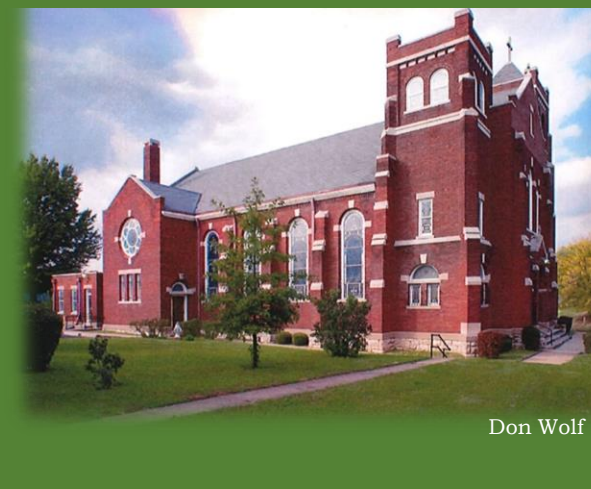

Dear Community,

I have repeatedly taught you that parables are usually proclaimed to emphasize one main point and that to try to find a meaning for each detail can obscure the point of these poignant stories. In other words, parables are not allegories.

However, I believe that in today's parable about the vineyard, Jesus meant the story to be interpreted more allegorically. In it, he traces salvation history and lovingly warns those who persist in rebellion against his teaching and his person that they will not prevail. He also graphically depicts his future rejection, passion, and death.

In this story the vineyard is Israel as we said in our response to Psalm 80: "The vineyard of the Lord is the house of Israel" (Isaiah 5:7a). The tenants are the chief priests and elders of the people. The servants sent to them are the prophets of old and finally the son is Jesus himself.

Following William Barclay, I believe this parable tells us much about God, about ourselves, and about Jesus. About God it teaches us that he is a creator who provides all we need to survive and flourish. It reveals to us how much God trusts and entrusts to us. It speaks of God's patience with us and his persistence in sending us prophets, messengers, and finally his only Son. It also reveals that there will come a final judgment.

This parable reveals a lot about ourselves. It speaks of our blessedness—the abundance God has given us. It emphasizes our free will, even when we misuse our freedom. It speaks of our rebellion and disobedience. And it also speaks of the ultimate accountability we all must eventually face.
